1. Terms of Submission

By submitting a document, the submitting authors agree that:

- They have authored the document;

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The submitting author accepts full responsibility for fulfilling the ethical requirements mentioned in this document.

6.2 Ethical requirements

For the purposes of this section, institutional guidelines refers to the protocols specified by the facility (or persons responsible for the facility) at which the research was conducted

For the purposes of this section 'research' includes, but is not restricted to,

- randomised control trials
- case control and cohort studies
- observational studies
- literature reviews

Conduct of the research was in accordance with institutional guidelines

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
